[ABOUT THE AMERICAN IMMIGRATION COUNCIL]





Would you miss the things they made?



[HONOREE BIOGRAPHIES]

Anthony Sullivan and Richard Adams

RICHARD ADAMS AND ANTHONY
"TONY" SULLIVAN ARE TRAILBLAZERS
IN THE LGBT IMMIGRANT RIGHTS
COMMUNITY. In 1975, thanks to one
courageous county clerk in Boulder,
Colorado, Richard and Tony were one of six
couples to be legally married in the state.
Because Tony was an Australian citizen,
Richard filed for resident status based on



their marriage. But an official letter from the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) stated their petition was denied because they "failed to establish that a bona fide marital relationship can exist between two faggots." The couple then sued to prevent Tony's deportation in 1979, resulting in the first federal lawsuit seeking equal treatment for a same-sex marriage in U.S. history.

The federal district judge upheld the INS decision and they also lost their appeals. They later filed a second suit arguing that Sullivan's deportation after the couple had been together for 8 years constituted "extreme hardship." The U.S. 9th Circuit Court of Appeals rejected their claims, making it possible for Sullivan to be deported. Following that loss, and with no place to go, they traveled the world for almost a year, but after missing family and friends, returned to the U.S. to live under the radar.

After years of living quietly, they bravely decided to appear at rallies and speak out in support of same-sex marriage. They risked Anthony's deportation, but both believed that taking a stand was worth it. On December 17, 2012, Richard Adams died after a short illness. He will always be remembered as a loving partner and an inspiring activist.

Today, Anthony Sullivan lives in California and continues to be an outspoken supporter of the LGBT immigration movement.

[HONOREE BIOGRAPHIES]

Staceyann Chin

STACEYANN CHIN IS A FULLTIME MOTHER, WRITER, PERFORMER, AND ACTIVIST. Chin has become known for documenting her abusive childhood in Jamaica and her life as a Jamaican, lesbian immigrant in her critically acclaimed memoir, The Other Side of Paradise.

After coming out in Jamaica, Chin faced discrimination and threats of violence. Despite this, she excelled in school but was eventually faced with the decision to stay in Jamaica or live her life openly in a foreign country. She chose to seek asylum in the United States and now lives in Brooklyn, New York.



Widely known as co-writer and original performer in the Tony award winning, Russell Simmons Def Poetry Jam on Broadway, she performs at the Nuyorican Poets' Café and in one-woman shows off-Broadway and around the globe. She also conducts writing-workshops around the world in which she pays particular attention to sexual violence. Chin encourages those women to look at the work together, to share experiences and, feelings about the work—then she helps them to make art out of their tragedy.

Chin's recent public writings about her foray into single-motherhood through in-vitro fertilization have now placed her in the conversation about women's reproductive rights. Her latest work challenges old definitions of family and offers one portrait of a 21st-century, urban, non-nuclear household headed by a woman who knowingly chose that path.

[Honoree Biographies]

Jose Antonio Vargas

JOSE ANTONIO VARGAS IS A PULITZER PRIZE-WINNING JOURNALIST AND THE FOUNDER OF DEFINE AMERICAN, a campaign that seeks to elevate the conversation around immigration. Vargas is also an undocumented immigrant living in New York City.

Vargas arrived in the United States at the age of 12, living with his maternal grandparents in a country he grew to love and adopt as his own. He did not learn of his undocumented status until he turned




16 and applied for a driver's license. He kept his status a secret and with the help of his friends and teachers, was able to pursue his dream of becoming a journalist. He came out as gay in high school in 1999, which he described as being less difficult than disclosing his legal status. In 2004, Vargas was hired at the *Washington Post* where he won a Pulitzer Prize in 2008 as part of a breaking news team.

In June, 2011, the New York Times Magazine published a groundbreaking essay he wrote in which he revealed and chronicled his life in America as an undocumented immigrant, stunning media and political circles and attracting worldwide coverage. A year later, he appeared on the cover of TIME magazine with fellow undocumented immigrants as part of a follow-up cover story. He testified at a Senate Judiciary Committee hearing this year on immigration reform and is currently finishing Documented, a documentary on his undocumented experience.


