ORDER

This matter coming before the Court on Plaintiff Alexander Say's Motion for Preliminary Injunction (Docket #4); Defendant John Adams having responded; Plaintiff having replied; the Kentucky Attorney General having been notified and having elected not to intervene; the Court being sufficiently advised;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Plaintiff's Motion for Preliminary Injunction is GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

(1) Defendants or their successors shall refrain from enforcing, against any lawful permanent resident alien, the provision of Kentucky statute K.R.S. 237.110(4)(b), which requires an applicant who seeks to obtain a license to carry a concealed deadly weapon ("CCDW license") be a citizen of the United States of America.

(2) Defendants or their successors shall forthwith furnish Mr. Say, a permanent resident alien, with the necessary application materials for a CCDW license, and shall accept and process the application in accordance with the established procedures for processing such application and issuing such license, but without requiring proof of United States citizenship.

(3) Unless repealed or modified by order of this Court, this Order shall remain in full

force and effect until: (a) a final judgment is entered following a trial of this case on the merits;
or (b) dismissal of this action.

(4) The Clerk is directed to send copies of this Order to all counsel of record.
